Caritas Cleans Up With Soap Donation

Two thousand bars of soap were distributed to a variety of organizations that Caritas Connections serves thanks to a generous contribution from the Keefe Group that was coordinated by Paul Scherer, Vice President at the company. U.S. Federal Probation Office—Helping Ex-Offenders Get Back on Their Feet

Many times, when ex-offenders are released from prison, they re-enter society with literally nothing more than the clothes on their backs. Many have no resources to help support them—which is where the Family Program run by the U.S. Federal Probation Office, Eastern District of Missouri tries to help.

Vashell Anderson, who helps coordinate the program, knows firsthand how important donations are to everyone involved. "Caritas Connections has been a blessing in assisting our ex-offenders and their families," said Anderson.



The U.S. Federal Probation Office keeps clothing, food and household items on hand to assist ex-offenders who are making the transition to life after prison.

"Every third Thursday in the month, Caritas brings us clothing and hygiene supplies that we distribute in a variety of ways," said Anderson. "We send items to Mers Halfway House, Dismas Halfway House and the SEMO halfway house in Cape Girardeau."

But that's just the beginning of how Caritas Connections helps assist. "Caritas has donated books and computers to our Education Department," said Anderson. "They've been a part of our Back to School drive donating educational supplies and personal shoppers have really helped out with our annual Christmas party by buying presents for the kids."

The original connection to the U.S. Probation Office came about through Judge Rodney Sippel. "From there, things have just blossomed," said Anderson. "Caritas has been very beneficial to our program and we are grateful every day for all that they do."

The U.S. Federal Probation Office is just one of many organizations, groups and places that benefit from the many works of Caritas Connections. GATHERING THE GOODS

Every month, six to eight pallets of groceries are delivered to the Caritas garage for distribution. They come from the Arnold Shop n' Save, where Matt Riley, who is the nighttime Manager of the store, gathers the items and arranges the delivery.

Matt has been coordinating these deliveries going on seven years now, helping to save Caritas hundreds, if not thousands of dollars on purchases. "I'm always on the lookout for deals and specials," said Matt. "If I can find some of our needed items on special, we can deliver a lot more for the people who need it."

Matt, who has been a parishioner of St. Gerard Majella for more than 15 years, first learned of Caritas Connections via Father Bryon. "Father Bryon used to buy groceries here and he asked me if they'd save money by buying in quantity. When I learned more about where these items were going. I was eager to help."

So a routine began that has grown as Caritas Connections has grown. Every month, Matt sets aside items like toilet paper, laundry, soap and nonperishable food items. With the growing list of personal shopper items. Matt has taken on even more responsibilities coordinating the effort.

But it's all worth it, according to Matt. "I really enjoy helping Caritas save money on items they need. And as a night manager, I'm kind of used to staying behind the scenes."

For all of his continued work. though, we want to shine the spotlight on Matt and also thank Shop n' Save for their on-going donations of soda and water for the Caritas Golf tournament.
