GIVING BACK KEEPS YOU COMING BACK

When Marge Rich first began donating her time to Caritas she was primarily involved in bread pick-ups from Amighetti's and occasionally helped out with stocking items in the garage.

Each year, her involvement has increased. Currently she serves as a Personal Shopper for Our Lady's Inn and helps coordinate efforts with Lois Etling regarding Caritas' participation in the Back@You program. This year, Caritas Connections contributed 500 bags of snacks and 500 bags of personal care items to the 500 backpacks that were distributed.

"This is the third year we've been involved in the Back@You program," said Marge. "We've now got it down to an assembly line like process as we've developed a logical order for purchasing and packing all the items that go into each backpack."

Caritas Connections joined many other organizations in donating all the items to fill 500 backpacks: hoodies, hats, gloves, regular/thermal socks, flashlights, water bottles, etc., along with hand-made scarves, some of which were made by Caritas volunteers.

Marge plans on staying involved with the program and continues to help Our Lady's Inn by providing often-requested items. "No one would ever expect a new pillow would be on that list," said Marge. "But when you have pregnant women who will be spending six months at the facility, you have no idea how much a new pillow is appreciated."
