We've donated laptops to help exoffenders better pursue their educational pursuits. We've partnered with other organizations to provide backpacks filled with everyday essentials for the homeless. We are always open to new ways to help and ready to embrace new ways to serve.

Going back to 2011, we had cash donations of \$8,716 and cash expenses of \$4,429. Compare that to a projected total of more than \$240,000 in donations for 2019 with cash expenses projected to be more than \$270,000 and you can see the dramatic growth of the organization that has occurred over the past few years. With that growth comes responsibility.

Through the years, we have never lost sight of our core mission: to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and help the sick, suffering and homeless. How we do that continues to evolve. With an aging population and the gap between those who have and those who do not continuing to increase, the need for what Caritas provides is perhaps more important than ever.

Our thanks go out to the many people who contribute to Caritas Connections in so many ways. Together, we are doing great things. But we also know there is so much more we can do.

FCSLA Challenge **Grant Met**

Ursuline Academy Makes Another Splash with Caritas

a 'Splash Week' where students of this all female high school design and sell their own clothing. For every sale made, two canned food items are donated as part of the transaction. Fr. Dempsey's Charities-**Helping Men Transition**

Since 1906, Father Dempsey's Charities has provided transitional housing and a safe place to give a fresh start to men without a home. By offering affordable room and board, men seeking a stable environment during a time of personal change receive support in their transition to independent living. What makes Fr. Dempsey's Charities special is the sense of community that the residents share with each other and staff. As Office Manager Donna Kestler described it, "We worry about our guys

Residents look out for each other and provide support. "There's always someone there to help," stated resident Charlie Bean, referring to the full-time staff as well as residents who work part-time at the front desk on nights and weekends and volunteer to maintain the facility.

Donna Kestler is the primary contact for Caritas Connections and is grateful for the assistance provided. She explained that the facility is financially self-sufficient and donations help

> improve the quality of life for the men. Charging for room and board assists in two ways—it is the primary source of the facility's funds, and it also provides a sense of responsibility to the residents as they transition to becoming self-sufficient. Donations from Caritas include toiletries to assist new residents when they arrive, and food which helps the facility provide healthier meals. "More meat and less starch is a blessing, especially for many dealing with diabetes," says Kestler. "Caritas always asks 'What do we need?', and then finds a way to deliver it! I don't know what we would do without them."

GIVING BACK ONE SHOPPING CART AT A TIME

"I hate to shop!" confesses MARY HUSKY. That's not exactly the response you would expect from someone volunteering as personal shopper. And that's not the impression she gives while she describes finding a great deal on an item needed for Fr. Dempsey's Charities, the client organization she supports. The excitement in her voice causes just a bit of disbelief about her statement **JOANNE TUREK** is another Caritas Connections volunteer that shops for Fr. Dempsey's. But Joanne flat out admits that she has a "passion for shopping" and enjoys putting it to good

Caritas makes an extra effort to provide our client organizations with items they specifically request, and items that cannot be purchased with food stamps.
