### Generosity of donors helps Caritas continue mission

Caritas Connections sent out its annual appeal letter in late October, asking for continued financial support of this all-volunteer organization. Thanks to the generosity of our donor base, both the clients we serve and the amount of goods we've distributed continues to grow.

The letter noted that since 2016, donations to Caritas have increased 16% while the amount that we have donated has increased by more than 75%. In 2016, we distributed \$137,600 worth of goods. In 2019, we're projected to deliver more than \$240,000 worth of food, clothing, household and personal care items.

Caritas serves organizations throughout the metro St. Louis area on both sides of the river. The food, clothing and personal care items that we deliver fill a real need, helping the poor and underprivileged. The difference that we make is dramatic. Yet there is so much more we can do as the number of homeless, along with our aging population, continues to be on the rise.

The goal of this year's appeal is to raise \$75,000 by the end of the year. To help with that effort, there is a challenge grant where the Caritas Board of Directors has agreed to personally match any donation up to \$20,000.

The annual appeal has increased in importance where it has now surpassed the Caritas Connections golf tournament as the number one source of funding for the organization. # **Hunger Is Closer Than You Think**

Often we assume that "those in need" are limited to the inner city or historically poor neighborhoods. We don't expect to find families struggling with hunger in West County, but the need exists. As part of its efforts to significantly increase the amount of food and personal care items it donates, Caritas Connections has been expanding its relationship with several organizations near its base in Kirkwood, MO.

Two years ago Caritas joined the efforts of Trinity Church to support the Robinson Cares Food Pantry, for families in need at Robinson Elementary. As Caritas is known to go above and beyond, it decided that a gap could be filled by contributing fresh and frozen foods. These foods provide higher nutritional value than typical food pantry

items and a tasty boost to mealtimes that frequently lack in quality. Caritas donated a freezer and a refrigerator to the food pantry for storage. Caritas now provides monthly donations of frozen meals, meat, dairy, eggs and fresh fruit. Our personal shoppers work with Trinity Church and school counselors to fine tune the specific needs and help to provide balanced diets, which is proven to help students succeed in school.

Caritas also supports Kirkwood **Nutrition of the Weekends**, a program that provides meals for over 125 students each weekend. Once again, Caritas asked how it could fill a need, and is now donating personal care items each month.

Most recently Caritas became involved with a third client organization

> in our backyard with Barretts Elementary School's **PTO** to provide meals for food-insecure students. Each Friday needy students are discretely given a backpack full of food items to be consumed over the weekend-when school sponsored meals aren't available to them. Caritas is contributing non-perishable food items to this program.

These clients are just some of many organizations, groups and places that benefit from the many works of Caritas Connections. #### MAKING FRIENDS AND **CONNECTIOINS**

It's not surprising that a teacher and mother would see the importance in assist ing with food-insecure students in local neighborhoods As a teacher Gretchen Whittington was well aware of the link between food insecurity in students and their performance and behavior in school. As a mother she knew that students struggling with hunger negatively affect all students, including her own.

So as a volunteer at Caritas, Gretchen has worked to develop and support the relationships with food pantries and weekend food programs at several local schools. She is currently the personal shopper for both the Robinson Cares Food Pantry and the Kirkwood NOW weekend meals program.

Gretchen first started participating with Caritas five years ago as a way to get involved with her church, St. Gerard Majella, where the tireless activities of Fr. Tom Bryon were an inspiration to her. "I love to organize things, and I started by helping once a week to prepare food deliveries. Each Monday our team has quite the challenge of assessing and organizing the food we've received for delivery the next day to about ten client organizations," Gretchen said. "I've really enjoyed working with our Monday morning team and I made some great friends along the way."

As she became aware of Caritas' increased activity donating purchased food and personal care items, Gretchen helped make the connection with the school food pantries. When she went to work part time as the art teacher at Assumption grade school, more flexibility was needed in her volunteer schedule. That's when the role as personal shopper became a perfect fit.
