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
# STAYING The newsletter of Caritas Connections, Inc.

Room at the Inn is a place where women, children and families work to become as self-sufficient as they can with the help of some specialized guidance that focuses on mental health, budget and financing, employment opportunities, parenting and nutrition.

Located in Bridgeton, Room at the Inn can accommodate up to 20 people at a time, children included. Their stays may be anywhere from two weeks to six months. With an ever-changing list of guests, each with their own particular needs, keeping supplies of personal hygiene products along with clothes and everyday items like bath towels and sheets is no easy task.

According to Melanie Matthew, Program Director at Room at the Inn, "Caritas came in at a time when we needed them the most. Due to the pandemic, we had to restructure our program and needed extra resources to support that change. Caritas stepped in and helped fill that void. Today, they help provide us with what our guests need, when they need it."

> "We are blessed to work with Caritas Connections," said Matthew. "Their ability to provide personal hygiene products, as well as brand new clothes, bath towels, pillows, blankets, comforters and even storage bins and car seats for infants continues to make a huge difference in helping our guests get back on their feet again. Since our clients are sheltering in place, all these items are a huge help to us."

### client profile: Circle of Concern

The relationship that Caritas Connections has developed with Circle of Concern takes our mission of connecting those who have with those who need to a whole new level.

Circle of Concern is a food pantry in west St. Louis County that has been helping to feed the hungry and provide assistance to low-income families in the surrounding area since 1967. With a paid staff of 5 employees and more than 300+ volunteers, they work as one to help reduce hunger and poverty.

A few years ago, they began donating some of their excess items like sample size shampoo or conditioner bottles to Caritas thanks to Chris Gibbons. During the pandemic, their donations to Caritas increased and a lot of the items they were able to donate like incontinence products and other personal care items that aren't covered by food stamps proved to be a great help to the clients that Caritas serves.

According to Michelle Lepak, who is the Pantry Director at Circle of Concern, "we're happy to work with Caritas because we never want to see donated items go to waste. With Caritas, it's great to see two non-profit organizations working together towards a common goal."
