Seeing the Big Picture with Caritas

When you see a Caritas Connections van drive by, you know that good is being delivered.

Caritas Connections is blessed to have so many volunteers doing such a wide variety of tasks on different days, at different places. These activities take place throughout the year, seven days a week, with different people stepping up to pitch in all committed to helping provide much needed food, personal care products and items to those in need.

One is reminded of the blind men trying to describe an elephant, each not really able to see the sum of the parts of what makes an elephant, an elephant! With that in mind, we'd like to share with you a brief overview of just what goes on every week with Caritas Connections.



Monday Volunteers in the garage are busy sorting, organizing and labeling items for the Tuesday morning pickup. Pickups of bread, pastries and other items take place at five different locations. Meanwhile, items stored in the Fenton warehouse (that is so graciously donated space for us) is picked up and delivered to the garage.

Every week, items are labeled and stacked in the garage by volunteers with more volunteers doing the job of delivering all these items to our different clients.

Tuesday Volunteers gather early in the morning, loading vans and personal vehicles that all head out, fully loaded with deliveries, dropping off food items at nine clients. Pickups from donors are also delivered by volunteers and delivered to the garage.

The Caritas garage located at Saint Gerard Majella is continually stocked and re-stocked.

Wednesday This is a day when both pickups and deliveries are in full swing. Deliveries are made to some of our North side clients while pickups take place from multiple teams of volunteers at multiple locations.

Thursday Another team of volunteers gets to work in the garage, sorting, organizing and labeling items while volunteers who oversee collecting and storing items in our Fenton warehouse make deliveries to the garage in preparation for Friday client deliveries. Meanwhile, volunteers pick up items from six different clients and deliver them to the warehouse.

Volunteers regularly pick up and deliver items to our Fenton warehouse where space is donated, allowing us to expand the items we keep on hand.

Friday Another big delivery day, this one primarily to our south St. Louis clients as both vans head out to different destinations, one of which also makes pickups of food items that are brought back to the garage. Meanwhile, other volunteers are making pickups from our generous donor base.

Saturday A team of volunteers take turns with our Saturday deliveries,

making stops at two different client locations. And another team of volunteers take turns in making pickups from four different retail donors

Sunday More pickups take place at two different donor locations, delivered by a team of volunteers.

That's just a brief weekly overview. There are also regular monthly pickups and deliveries to a variety of clients—and not just food orders, either. Personal care items, laptops that have been wiped clean of information and prepared for use as well as occasional clothing items are also delivered. Add in our dedicated shoppers who deal with our clients direct, buying and then delivering specific items directly to the client they serve allows us to bring a whole new level of service to our client base.

Then, throughout the year, there are countless drives and special activities that take place where contributions from volunteers have continued to help Caritas Connections in our mission to serve those in need. Backpack collections, canned food drives, socks and winter coat collections—the list goes on—and so does our gratitude to each and every volunteer as well as our many donors—both individuals and our corporate sponsors.

So whatever part you may play in making Caritas Connections what it is today, thank you. Our work is far from done. There is so much good we can do.
