Caritas Delivers One Last Time for Back@You Program



Nerinx Hall Students Deliver Large Sandwich Order to Caritas Clients

A team of several young women from Nerinx Hall High School recently partnered with Caritas to deliver sandwiches to multiple Caritas clients. Nerinx donated the sandwiches and Caritas provided chips, drinks, and desserts. Forming a production line, they assembled and packed the lunches and later delivered 500 of them to St. Francis Xavier church and another 500 to Fr. Dempsey's program.

According to Becky Giunta, who works at Nerinx, and also volunteers her time with Caritas, "they were all happy to serve and glad they could help while also learning more about the mission of Caritas."

For several years, Caritas has supported the BACK@YOU program, which distributes backpacks filled with essential items that help make life on the streets a little easier for the homeless. This year, our efforts reached across the state as Dan and Gina Bauman, who recently moved to Kansas City, provided the personal hygiene bags, and then drove them to St. Louis in time for distribution in late October. Marge and Keith Rich once again provided nonperishable food items that get included in the backpacks. A special thank you to Lois Etling as well, who acquired personal hygiene items for the first five years of the program and also assisted with packing.

Since 2015, the BACK@YOU program grew in size and scope. Over the past seven years, they have distributed more than 3200 filled backpacks to the homeless throughout the St. Louis metro area. Socks, hand-knit scarves, gloves, fleece throws, sleeping bags, a variety of non-perishable foods as well as personal hygiene items all help fill the backpacks. It's been a labor of love, supported by many volunteers and we've been happy

to help. Unfortunately, this is the last year for BACK@YOU as the founder, Kathy Acre, is stepping down.
