Takes its Toll

Thanks to the generosity of both our donors and volunteer network, Caritas Connections continues to fulfill its core mission of helping the poor and underserved in the St. Louis metro area.

For the year, we spent \$297,000 on food, clothing, personal care items, computer equipment, diapers, pullups and wipes and other supplies that go directly to our clients—more than any year in our history. But that increase in spending was primarily due to a more than 20% increase in costs due to rising inflation.

Our total income, consisting of individual and corporate contributions, Gifts in Kind and of our Golf Tournament, was more than \$264,000. As a result, we had to dip into our reserve funds to offset the difference. This was also a first for the organization—but a reason why we maintain a reserve in the first place.

Towards the end of 2022, we put a hold on taking on any additional clients. We are also actively pursuing more grants through a variety of resources in the hopes of helping to offset continued rising prices.

As an organization, we have always kept

our expenses as low as possible. Because Caritas has no salaried employees and because of donations of many required services, such as auto repair and warehouse space, we operate with extremely low overhead.

Once again, our overhead was less than 5% of our total expenditures for the year. That means that for every dollar donated, more than \$.95 goes directly to helping the poor. That is a formula that we have no intention of deviating from-now or in the future.

Although there is still an adequate amount of money set aside for unexpected needs, we hope to avoid reducing those reserves this year-which is why we ask that if you have given before, to please give again-and possibly increase your amount to help offset the cost of inflation. Consider being a sponsor in our annual golf tournament. And if your employer does matching donations, please reach out to them before you donate. Socks 4 Soles **Delivers Once Again**

Socks 4 Soles is a grassroots based, non-profit organization dedicated to helping people affected by homelessness in the St. Louis metro area. For those in need, socks have always been the most requested, but least donated item.

Over the past 7 years, Socks for Soles has helped thousands of people in need and brought awareness to how donating something so simple as a pair of socks can have such a meaningful outcome. In 2021, the effort was expanded to include gloves and underwear for men, women, and children.

This past year, a total of 2,469 items were collected by Caritas volunteers where they were then boxed for later distribution. Special thanks goes out to Mark Green who coordinated the overall event and to Paul and Tara Scherer and their two sons, Paulie and David, who were instrumental in getting all of the items sorted, boxed and readied for distribution by Caritas volunteers.

Enterprise Holdings Foundation Grant Makes Holidays Brighter

When Ed Johnson, who works for Enterprise Holdings, submitted a grant proposal on behalf of Caritas Connections, he had no idea what a difference that donation would ultimately make.

This story began last June when Ed contacted Caritas and said he wanted to apply for a grant from the Enterprise Holdings Foundation. Ed has known Father Bryon for more than 50 years and mentioned how Father spent many hours mentoring and teaching so many of the values he still lives by to this day. His familiarity with Caritas made him believe the organization would be a great fit for a grant from the Enterprise Holdings Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Enterprise Holdings that is committed to strengthening the communities where the company operates.

In November, we were informed that the Enterprise Holdings Foundation had approved a \$5,000 grant on behalf of Caritas. It couldn't have come at a better time! Traditionally, Caritas has helped many of our clients provide Christmas gifts that help make the holidays a little brighter for those they

serve. A decision was made to use the money expressly for that purpose. Here's a look at how that \$5,000

grant money was put to use. • The Federal Probation Office received

- 26 frozen turkeys for Christmas dinners.
- Our Lady of Guadalupe received fruit, veggies, eggs, ground beef and chicken for their residents.
- Our Lady's Inn received 3 sets of new pots and pans and 3 car seats for residents' new households and for their children.
- St. Nicholas SVdP received several months of laundry detergent.
- The Wellston Center received new toaster ovens for making meals.
- The Crisis Nursery Outreach on Grand received kids' coats and toys for Christmas presents
- The Latino Crisis Nursery was able to give out small appliances (like can openers, coffee makers, toasters, etc.) as Christmas gifts for the families
- The Crisis Nursery Outreach in Festus gave out Christmas gifts for children and mothers as well as jackets, warm socks and picture frames.

Donated Laptops Help Detainees Pursue College Degree

Some detainees in the St. Louis County jail can now pursue a college degree to help them assimilate back into the community after they are released. And thanks to a dozen donated laptops provided by Caritas to the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services, they now have the online link needed to help them earn their degree.

The request for laptops came from St. Louis County Jail Director,

Scott Anders. Anders had previously worked for the U.S. Probation Office where he was involved in a similar program for ex-offenders.

"The goal is not for them just to complete the classes here, it's for them to continue on with their education when they're released," Anders said. "The laptops provided by Caritas help to make that possible."

Delivery of the laptops happened the day before classes began. The request for help came from Anders as there weren't any funds set aside for purchase of the laptops, Caritas continues to deliver refurbished laptops to Criminal Justice Ministries. But there was no plan in place to support this new program.

When classes began, the detainees were presented with their laptops and the pursuit of a college degree was underway.

Client Profile: Our Lady of Guadalupe

Ever since she retired in 2008, Betty Newberry has been known as the "worker bee" at the Our Lady of Guadalupe food pantry in Ferguson where food and other essential items are distributed to those in need. Caritas has been helping by delivering bread and sweets on a monthly basis for almost a decade.

This past month, a Caritas dedicated shopper began supplementing the monthly deliveries to help provide more specific items like diapers and other personal care products. "We try to do our own weekly shopping for everyday items but it's hard to get enough sometimes. That's where Caritas really helps to make a difference."

According to Betty, "During the worst of the pandemic, there were pop up food pantries all over the Ferguson area so the number of people we served actually went
