COVID Setbacks Lead to \$25,000 grant for Caritas Connections

The Missouri Department of Economic Development awarded Caritas Connections a \$25,000, one-time-only grant as part of the American Rescue Plan Act. Caritas was one of more than 250 not-for-profits in the state that were awarded this COVID relief money in the Fall of this year.

And what a relief it has been.

During COVID, we had to cancel our annual golf tournament, reduce the amount and frequency of our deliveries to our clients as well as our volunteer involvement. Those were tough times for everyone.

In the roughly two years since, expenses have gone up and donations have gone down—resulting in us having to cut our client budget by 15% and put a freeze on taking on new clients.

This past year, we began looking for new sources of funding to help carry on our mission. Grants were one avenue that we wanted to explore. When the opportunity to apply for the COVID relief grant money came along, Caritas definitely qualified and we submitted our proposal on a very tight timeline.

We owe a great deal of thanks to Kent Hornberger, who alerted us to the grant's existence. The grant money arrived in November and was quickly put to good use - allowing us to reinstate meat purchases starting in December that had been recently discontinued, and is allowing us to continue Christmas donations to several of our clients that we had planned on curtailing.

Though it's a one-time-only grant, the new funds are helping us return to our pre-pandemic giving numbers. And, as always, 95 cents out of every dollar spent, goes directly to the clients we serve.

Client Profile: Our Lady's Inn

Since 1982, Our Lady's Inn has served as a life-affirming alternative to abortion for over 7,000 women who have chosen life for their unborn babies. For more than 40 years, these families have been housed and supported in their efforts to live healthy and productive lives, achieve educational goals, gain employment, and secure stable housing.

Caritas has been happy to help Our Lady's Inn for more than seven years, providing a variety of food products, cleaning supplies and personal products that are put to good use at their south city location at Meramec and Compton.

According to Gloria Lee, Chief Program Officer at Our Lady's Inn, "Caritas allows us to choose what we need on an ongoing basis. We give them a monthly grocery list based on how many women and children are staying with us at the time. They bring us items like pancake mix, syrup, baking supplies, condiments,

canned fruit—it's a variety of food items."

Dedicated shoppers handle that list which also includes wet wipes, detergent, and cleaning supplies. In October, Caritas had to cut back on purchasing meat items due to cost-cutting measures. But that is now being reinstated in December.

"Meat is the hardest to come by," said Gloria. "We're grateful that we only went two months without the Caritas delivery. At any one time, we can have up to 16 families residing at our south city location—and we often have as many children as we have moms. Caritas does an outstanding job of helping us in our efforts to serve everyone who stays at Our Lady's Inn."

When asked about the volunteers who serve Our Lady's Inn, Gloria said, "They are so efficient, friendly and hardworking. They always ask how our clients and staff are doing. Our thanks go out to each and every volunteer at Caritas."
