Did You Know...

Caritas Connections is eligible for **matching gifts**. We are also now set up to receive **automatic monthly gifts via PayPal** or to take **stock donations**. Gifts of stock can be directly made from 401(k) plans or IRA accounts without needing to pay taxes on distribution—a big help if you no longer itemized because of recent tax changes. As a retiree who is required to take RMDs from your IRAs, you could lower your income tax liabilites by giving to Caritas Connections. Once you turn 70 ½, you must take annual Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from your Individual Retirement Accounts. By giving some or all of that RMD as a **Qualified Charitable Distribution**, or QCD, you could have tax advantages, even as you support Caritas Connections. Talk to your financial advisor for more information.

You can make your donation to Caritas Connections go further by taking advantage of the **Missouri Food Pantry Tax Credit** program that allows an individual, corporation, or trust to receive up to 50% of their gift back through a state of Missouri tax credit. The maximum value of the credit is \$2,500 for an individual or \$5,000 if filing jointly. If you make a donation of \$250 or more before December 31, 2024, Caritas Connections will mail you a tax form in February 2025. This form must be submitted with your state tax return. He was part of the Caritas Board for a short time—having to step away because of his health challenges. Wanting to continue to make an impact on our clients, he started the Socks for Souls campaign to benefit the unhoused. Barrels were placed by the SGM Christmas tree lot and the collection of socks and underwear took place during December. Each year it got bigger and eventually became tied into an Amazon wish list page. His passion for helping others and boundless enthusiasm will be greatly missed.

Caritas Extends Reach to SE Missouri

Four food pantries in southeast Missouri recently received a wide variety of personal care items, paper goods and laundry detergent, all donated by Caritas Connections along with diapers and wipes that were donated by Our Lady's Inn. The donations came about via a request from Marie Kenyon, who is the Social Outreach Coordinator of the Southern Vicariate of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

According to Marie, each one of the food pantries plays a vital role in helping the needy in southeast Missouri. The first stop was at Immaculate Conception parish in Park Hills, followed by the food pantry located at St. Joseph's parish in Bonne Terre. Twenty percent of the population of St. Francois County live below the poverty line and there is a 16% food insecurity rate. The next stop was at St. Agnes in Bloomsdale, which is the only food pantry in the area, followed by a stop at the St. Genevieve food pantry which serves several hundred families per month.

Dave Baranowski, who heads the stewardship office for the diocese, was the primary delivery driver of a van loaded with the donated items along with multiple other vehicles that made the trek. All those vehicles wouldn't have been necessary though, without the coordinated efforts of Mark and Dolores Guen-

ther and Larry Wise, who purchased all the items Caritas donated from several different retailers. Mark and Larry then put in some major sweat equity in organizing all the items to be delivered to the four different food pantries.

This marked the first time that Caritas worked in conjunction with the St. Louis Archdiocese as well as the first time Caritas items were delivered beyond the St. Louis metro area and it's just another example of how we help connect those who have with those who need.

Stockpile of canned goods distributed by Caritas

252 assorted cans of food. The amount may not be staggering, but how these cans made it to Caritas, to be delivered to our clients, we found to be yet another extraordinary example of how we connect those who have with those who need.

We received a call from an individual stating he'd like to donate a trunk full of canned goods, so arrangements were made to meet him at the Caritas garage. As we were unloading the assortment of canned goods, we asked where he got them all.

"I'd been preparing for the end of days," said the individual. "But recently, I rediscovered my faith. And I decided these cans could be put to a lot better use helping to feed the poor. So, I asked an acquaintance if he knew any place that might be interested in my donation. He told me about Caritas. So, I went to the Caritas website and knew this was the right decision. I didn't want to just drop the cans off at a food pantry. I really liked the idea of how all these cans will be distributed to places all over St. Louis."

As he was getting ready to leave, we asked if we could use his name. He requested to remain anonymous but asked if we could say, "This donation is in memory of Ryan Loftus." Yes, we most certainly can!

Client Profile: Criminal Justice Ministry

Since 1979, Criminal Justice Ministry (CJM) has served individuals, families, and communities impacted by the criminal justice system. From offering services to incarcerated individuals to providing reentry programs for those returning to the St. Louis area, CJM seeks to serve the needs of the most vulnerable without judgment.

CJM provides programs to individuals both inside area institutions and throughout the St. Louis community.

Caritas has supported Criminal Justice Ministry for more than seven years. Steve Proscino has been their dedicated shopper, providing snacks and other assorted items which are provided to ex-offenders. According to Sr. Geraldine Neier who is a First Services Liaison for CJM, "We know we can always count on the reliability of Caritas. And the snacks provided each month are always appreciated."

"People have no idea how hard it is for individuals who are reentering

society to get back on their feet," said Sr. Geraldine. "When some are first released from incarceration, they literally have nothing more than the clothes on their back - and even those may not have been

their own. We try to make sure they've got the basic necessities - food, clothing, hygiene items - and Caritas certainly helps in that regard."

CJM's mission is to improve our communities by supporting and empowering those impacted by incarceration, not judge them. According to Sr. Geraldine, "We and all those we serve are grateful for the support that Caritas provides."

Criminal Justice Ministry is just one of many organizations, groups and places that benefit from the many works of Caritas Connections. The

more people who volunteer their time as well as donate to the organization, the more people Caritas Connections can help. The need is great. The good you can do is immense.
